
Message and Structure of Mark:

- II. Jesus came to suffer (Mark 12-16).

Introduction to Mark: Background

- Author: John Mark (Acts 12:12), the cousin of Barnabas (Colossians 4:10);
- **Date written:** c. A.D. 63-70
- *History/Setting:* Jesus' followers were suffering, just as He suffered.
- **Purpose:** To present Jesus as the Ultimate Suffering Servant (leading to resilience) and to proclaim the Kingdom of God (leading to repentance).

Parallels between Mark and Philippians 2:1-13

- Jesus came as a servant (Mark 1-13; Philippians 2:1-7).
- Jesus died on a cross (Mark 14—15; Philippians 2:8).
- God exalted Jesus to glory (Mark 16; Philippians 2:9).
- Jesus' disciples carried the gospel to all nations (Mark 16:15-16; Philippians 2:10-11).
- God assures us that He is at work in and through us (Mark 16:19-20; Philippians 2:12-13).

"the noble choice to forgo your status, deploy your resources or use your influence for the good of others before yourself ... the humble person is marked by a willingness to hold power in service of others."


