Sermon Follow-up | April 26, 2020

1 Book of History — The Witness of Peter Focus Passage: Acts 10:1–43 Additional Context: Acts 10:1–48; 11:18 Corollary Scripture... Genesis 1:28; 12:3; Isaiah 49:6; Matthew 28:19; Luke 2:32 Other Passages Referenced:

Sermon Recap: Peter's gospel witness to Cornelius and his household introduces a new work of God to offer salvation and the Holy Spirit to non-Jewish people, including Gentiles as members of His people. Although it was a new thing in practice, it was something God foretold in Genesis 1:28; 12:3, Isaiah 49:6, and other Scripture passages. In Acts, God is doing new things that He had already told us about. He was forming a new community no based on a common lineage, language, or land, but rather a common Savior and LORD. To bring about this new active and intentional mission to Gentiles, God supernaturally interrupted both the Gentile Cornelius and Peter the Apostle with separate visions and instructions. Peter needed Cornelius and Cornelius needed Peter. All of his life, Peter had viewed Gentiles as unworthy of salvation—unclean people who ate unclean food and lived unclean lives. Peter's vision repeated three times until he understood that God was telling him the Gentiles would no longer be avoided as unclean. Both Peter and Cornelius prayed, listened, and obeyed; otherwise they would have missed the new thing God wanted to do through them. The gospel is not good news for good people. It is good news for all people. That good news may interrupt and lead us to do what we and others would have thought to be unbelievable behaviors.

- 1. In your experience with prayer, how do you pursue the "listen" and "obey" parts? How do you know you are hearing God's voice as compared to your own inner voice or other voices? Can you share a specific example of a time when you prayed and sensed God speak to you? How did you respond?
- 2. As you think about God doing a new thing in this moment:
 - a. What new learning are you pondering as a result of this pandemic?
 - b. What new person is God asking you to invite into the new community?
 - c. What new person is God telling you to send for and to ask them to speak into your life?
