Small Group Questions | March 25th, 2018

Palm Sunday, Kingdom Stories - The Ten Bridesmaids (Matthew 25:1-13 NLT)

Sermon Recap: The parable of the bridesmaids teaches us that the **wise watch & wait despite the delay**. This delay is a **known delay of unknown length**. They watch & wait **with Jesus**. They watch because it's **worth the wait**. Jesus calls us to a life with him while we wait for his return.

Hook: These questions can help encourage conversation.

- 1. When was the last time you were unprepared? What was the outcome?
- 2. What wedding tradition is most meaningful to you?

Look: Read the sermon passage. Answer the following textual questions.

- 3. According to verses 3-4, what distinguishes the wise bridesmaids from the foolish?
- 4. Why does the groom not open the door for the foolish bridesmaids?
- 5. At the end of the parable, what does Jesus command us to do? Why?
- 6. In reading Matt 1:23, 28:20 and 12:20, how do these verses shape how we wait with Jesus?

Took: Applying the message to our lives.

- 7. Do you feel like your light growing brighter or dimming? What is the cause?
- 8. How can we be intentional about waiting with Jesus and not on our own?
- 9. What role does community play in our waiting?
- 10. What can we hope for while we wait? What does it look like to hope now?
