What is the Bible?

- "Bible" = ta biblia (Greek) = "the books"
- · 2 Testaments:
 - Old Testament (39 books; Hebrew/Aramaic)
 - New Testament (27 books; Koine Greek)
- Records the story of God's interactions with creation from "beginning" to "end."
- Includes: History (What happened), Theology (What we believe), and Ethics (How we live).

How Does Culture View the Bible?

- · Just another religious book.
- · Just another regular book.
- · A self-help book.
- · An unreliable ancient text
- · A nice "book-shelf" resource
