#### The Table Manners of Jesus—Luke 9:10-17

- Provision
  - Jesus' table manner of provision moves us from desolation to satisfaction.

"The word 'all' is equally significant. Nowhere did Torah and oral tradition regulate Jewish life more prescriptively than at table. The effect of kosher was to ensure that proper foods, properly prepared, were properly eaten; unclean foods and unclean persons were necessarily excluded.

At the wilderness banquet the ritual of kosher is abandoned in favor of an open invitation and inclusion of all people. 'They all ate and were satisfied.' The meal provided by Jesus does not 'tide the crowd over' until something more substantial can be had.

The meal is so sufficient and satisfying that a basket of leftovers remains for each of the disciples."

There is a beautiful expression in the Gospels that appears only twelve times and is used exclusively in reference to Jesus or the Father. That expression is "to be moved with compassion." The Greek verb splangchnizomai reveals to us the deep and powerful meaning of this expression. The splagchna are the entrails of the body, or as we might say today, the guts.

They are the place where our most intimate and intense emotions are located...When the Gospels speak about Jesus' compassion as he being moved in the entrails, they are expressing something very deep and mysterious.

The compassion that Jesus felt was obviously quite different from superficial or passing feelings of sorrow or sympathy. Rather, it extended to the most vulnerable part of Jesus' being."
