Vision:

Expectations and Responsibilities for Mentors and Mentees

Who is a Mentor?

Someone who is one or more life stages ahead (spiritually or physically) who is willing to walk alongside a mentee, sharing life, Truth, and encouragement for the purpose of discipleship.

What can you expect your mentor to be to you?

- Committed to keeping Christ central in her life
- Faithful, available, teachable
- Humble, honest and vulnerable
- A listener and encourager
- A guide
- A prayer partner and accountability partner
- A sister in Christ, committed to this journey together

What can you NOT expect your mentor to be to you?

- *Jesus* but she can point you to Him
- A fixer
- A professional counselor
- A biblical authority
- Your best friend or earthly mother
- Someone who has all the same perspectives or experiences as you
- Someone who completely understands or agrees with you
- A woman with a perfect life she has challenges and needs of her own
- Available 24-hours a day

Who is a mentee?

Someone who desires to grow in Christ and is willing to make a discipling relationship a priority.

What are your responsibilities as a mentee?

To be:

Humble
Flexible
Willing to be challenged

Teachable
Vulnerable
Forgiving of themselves and their mentor

Adaptable
Honest
Committed to this journey together

The mentor relationship should be a safe, confidential friendship that offers mutual care, respect and sharing, thereby fostering mutual growth.

Relationship expectations:

- Mentors and mentees are required to attend the Reveal Dinner. Here your match will be revealed and you will have time to make an initial connection.
- Mentors will be required to attend one training prior to the Reveal Dinner and encouraged to attend one meeting halfway through for feedback and continued equipping.
- Mentors and mentees are required to meet together 2-3 times per month.
- Mentors and mentees are required to complete online exit survey at the end of the session.
- Return all phone calls, texts, and emails from each other within 24 hours, if possible.
- Commit to scheduled meetings do not cancel or reschedule unless it's an emergency.
- Be flexible in adjusting your schedule to determine meeting times.
- Be respectful of one another's time.
- If you have children, make arrangements so that you will not be distracted when you meet.
- At the Reveal Dinner, each mentor will be assigned a caller who will check-in with mentors approximately 2 to 3 times to receive feedback. Please connect with your caller within 3 days of their initial call.
- Each pair will be given a card with a leadership team member's contact information. Please don't hesitate to contact this person if ever you have a question or concern.

Making the best use of your time:

- Brainstorm before you meet and prioritize your ideas, desires, goals or topics of interest for this relationship in their order of importance to you.
- Share your goals/ideas at your first meeting and discuss how you might want to accomplish them.
- Select a resource to facilitate a productive and useful time together.
- Use the journal provided to document your goals, questions, thoughts, ideas and prayer requests.
- Settle on a mutually agreeable agenda for your meetings (e.g. time set aside for catching up, prayer, study/resource discussion etc.) Typically, it's best to start each meeting by giving the mentee an opportunity to share any questions or comments she may have.
